Abstract: Persons with disabilities are recognised as being acutely impacted by climate change, particularly in countries that are at the forefront of the climate crisis. At the same time, research indicates that a very limited number of countries include any reference to persons with disabilities in their climate policies and commitments. If climate action is to reach the most affected, it is vital that it includes those most marginalised to meet their needs and draw on their capacities. Our side event will present some recent evidence and recommend measures to make sure that persons with disabilities and their representative organizations are at the front and centre of a rights-based response to climate change.
